

The Alef (א) to Tav (ת) Pesach Quiz

A few guidelines (and tips) in order to make the most out of this quiz:

- If you are running the quiz in public, read the questions out loud, and wait for the other participants to 'shout back' the answers.
- The answers are always in Hebrew.
- The first letter of each answer starts with the Hebrew letter found left of the questions (answers on the next page).
- Most of the answers to the questions below can be found by reading through the Haggadah in Hebrew (or in phonetics with the English translation). In some cases, the answers are derived from general knowledge.

א	The key number of Passover (in Hebrew). # of cups, # of children, # of mothers etc.
ב	The Hebrew name of the last (and deadliest) plague. The Hebrew term for the firstborn (in plural).
ג	In English - redemption; what the people of Israel experienced during their Exodus out of Egypt and in the desert (1) Gezer גזר (2) Gavohah גבוה (3) Gadol גדול (4) Geulah גאולה
ד	The (Hebrew) name of the first plague; a red liquid.
ה	'Telling' or 'recounting' in Hebrew. The name of the text used on the first (and second) night of Passover.
ו	The first words of a famous liturgical poem in the Haggadah that mentions God's promise to save the Jewish people in every generation from its adversaries. (1) Vehigadeta Lebincha והגדת לבנך (2) Vehi Sheamda והיא שעמדה (3) Veahavta Lereacha Kamocho ואהבת לרעך כמוך (4) Vesamachta Bechagecha ושמחת בהגך
ז	The currency used in the song Chad Gadya (חד גדיא), the popular Aramaic Passover song.
ח	The (wise) child who gets to learn about the Afikoman in the Haggadah is called in Hebrew ...
ט	A ritual we do twice while reading the Haggadah. Dipping in English. (1) Tahor טהור (2) Teref טרף (3) Tvila טבילה (4) Tayas טיס
י	The Hebrew name of what we are asked to drink while reading the Haggadah. Red or white or grape juice.
כ	In Hebrew 'to bind' or 'combine.' The section in the Haggadah in which we create the Passover Sandwich.
ל	Who knows two? I know two. Two is in Hebrew (two words) – straight from Sinai.
מ	The Hebrew names of two food items related to Passover that start with מ. We are specifically asked to eat them while reading through the Haggadah.
נ	The second word (in Hebrew) in the questions that the youngest participant is encouraged to ask. In English it means 'has changed' or 'has become different.'
ס	The Hebrew word for order or organization. The Hebrew name of the Haggadah reading ceremony and festive meal on the first (and second) night(s) of Passover.
ע	We start counting it during the next night after the (first) Seder (or during the second Seder) for 49 days.
פ	Because his heart is so stiff, he is pounded by at least 10 blows. The bad guy of Passover.
צ	The name of the section in the Seder that is supposed to help keep the children awake. When we search for the Afikoman. The last part of the festive meal. Means hidden or concealed in English (1) Tzedek צדק (2) Tzafoon צפון (3) Tzfardea צפרדע (4) Tzli צלי
ק	The first part of the Seder blessing over the wine (or grape juice) to sanctify the occasion.
ר	The title of Yehudah, Yossi, Eliezer and Akiva (who are quoted in the Haggadah). In English 'the great one.'
ש	The number of days (in Hebrew) we celebrate Passover and don't eat Chametz (two options, both start with ש).
ת	The Hebrew definition of a naive person. In the Haggadah it describes a child who asks: 'What is this?'
